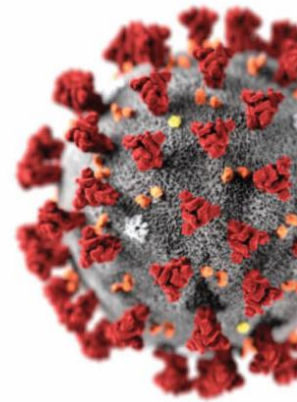

Reminders:

- 1 If you are sick, **DO NOT WAIT** to get medical care, especially if it is difficult to breathe.
- 2 If you are tested for COVID-19, **DO NOT WAIT** for your results to get medical care if your symptoms worsen.
- 3 COVID-19 testing at our testing facility is available regardless of insurance coverage.
- 4 COVID-19 testing at our testing facility is free for residents, regardless of insurance coverage.

COVID SENIOR SCAMS

AVOID CORONAVIRUS SCAMS

Don't respond to texts, emails or calls about checks from the government.

Ignore online offers for vaccinations. There are no products proven to treat or prevent COVID-19 at this time. Be wary of ads for test kits. The FDA just announced approval for one home test kit, which requires a doctor's order. But most test kits being advertised have not been approved by the FDA, and aren't necessarily accurate.

Hang up on robocalls. Scammers are using illegal robocalls to pitch everything from low-priced health insurance to work-at-home schemes.

Watch for emails claiming to be from the CDC or WHO. Use sites like [coronavirus.gov](https://www.coronavirus.gov) and [usa.gov/coronavirus](https://www.usa.gov/coronavirus) to get the latest information. And don't click on links from sources you don't know.

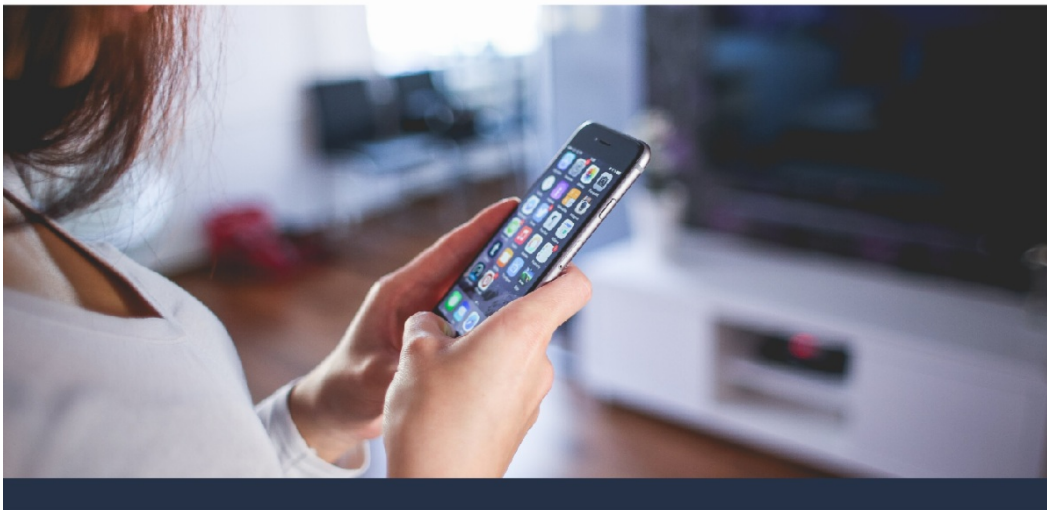

Keeping Kids Safe: What Parents/Guardians Can Do.

COVID-19 HAS INCREASED YOUTH'S ONLINE PRESENCE.

- Try to be a good role model (tech behavior)
- Have dinner together as a family
- Encourage a balanced life that includes outdoor activities
- Recognize the difference between heavy use and excessive/obsessive use
- Recognize that obsessive technology use could be a symptom of other issues
 - Pay attention to their online activities and how it relates to their mood (look for signs of distress)
 - Be nearby while they're doing homework
 - Consider banning tech devices from bedroom after bedtime
- Set limits and consider using parental controls built into game consoles and PC operating systems

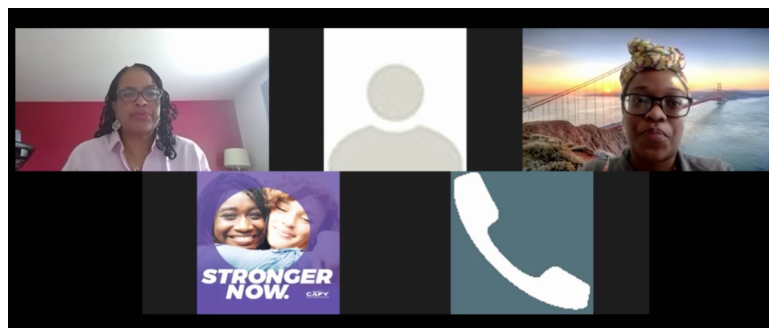
